PREREQUISITE:

ARTS 1316 Drawing 1

DESCRIPTION OF COURSE (as in catalog)

Expansion of ARTS 1316 stressing the expressive and conceptual aspects of drawing, including the human figure within a spatial environment. Regular outside assignments. (3 semester hrs; 6 studio)

TEXTBOOK:

None required

OBJECTIVES AND GOALS OF COURSE:

To be able to effectively draw realistically and expressively in a limited number of media and gain artistic appreciation of art through drawing and studying drawings.

PERFORMANCE/LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Gain more advanced drawing skills.
Explore various drawing media.
Draw the human face and figure.
Draw within spatial environments, including the use of linear, aerial and other forms of perspective.
Exhibit creativity, expression, realism, abstraction and other artistic abilities.
Gain a greater appreciation of drawing through the application of basic art elements and principles and exposure to different approaches to drawing.

REQUIRED EXAMINATIONS:

Complete hands-on projects and knowledge tests

EVALUATIONS:

Performance tests including problem solving, execution, creativity, neatness, organization, functionality, deadlines and presentation and personal professionalism.
Specific instructions for each assignment are given on a written and printed handout at the beginning of the course. Standards will be set through examples shown during the lectures and also evaluation determined by the instructor's professional experience and expectations of the field of art.

ATTENDANCE

No more than 3 class periods may be missed for classes that meet 3 times per week and no more than 2 class periods may be missed for classes that meet twice per week. After the limit, final class grade can be reduced and the student will be advised by the instructor concerning continuing or withdrawing from the course.
